"ASK"



Ask. There are a lot of programs that we use to encourage recruiting members. This year we are continuing the Wanted Program. On the back page of this magazine you will find the most recent winners of this recruiting program. At the end of last year's program we looked at the data and found that we could

attribute nearly 1000 members to the success of this program. We hope that this year's program will produce the same or better results. Each of those new members represents someone who was asked or invited into Ruritan by one of our existing members.

Recently, I was reading another service club's magazine. On the front cover it announced a new, exciting growth program and directed the reader to a page in the magazine. When I turned to that page all it said was "ASK" in large letters. It really is that easy. All you have to do is ask.

We had a session at our summer leadership conference by our publicity and public relations committee. They talked about all of the tools that were available to our clubs and members for publicizing Ruritan. We have billboards, audio public service announcements for radio, video public service announcements for TV, and all sorts of brochures and guides. They ended their session by asking all the attendees to discuss at their tables how they came to be Ruritan members. After the discussion time was over each table was to report out their most unique story of how people become members. We listened as table after table reported out. We never heard, "I saw it on a billboard" or "I found you on the internet". What we did hear was story after story about a friend or a relative <u>asking</u> the member to join their club. We all have expectations with regard to the power of advertising or public service announcements or billboards. If those expectations are that people will recognize our brand, that's healthy. To expect that those things will do the work for us is not healthy. We have to ask. Ask someone to join your Ruritan Club this month.

In addition to asking members to join your Ruritan Club, I believe that it is critical to our organization that we get back in the business of building new Ruritan Clubs in new communities. When Curtis Graham was alive and working at the national office in Dublin his primary job was to encourage and assist volunteers in organizing Ruritan Clubs. Curtis was magic. He would spend the better part of everyday talking to people on the phone and getting them excited about the possibility of growing a new club in a new community. Most years, just through encouragement from Curtis, volunteers would build 25 or more adult clubs. We haven't done that in years. We need to begin to put emphasis on building clubs again.

We hope you had a good summer and are making plans to join us for your national convention in Greensboro. You can find information on the convention on pages 6-8.




Boys tunes. The three pictures at the top right of the page feature Rocky Hock Opry acts.

Ballot Issues for 2015 National Convention

Delegates to the 2015 Ruritan National Convention will have two National Bylaws amendments to consider on the ballot in January in Greensboro. As required, both of these items were passed by the National Board of Directors before coming before the delegates.

Bylaws Issue #1

Vote to change National Bylaws Article V - Officers. Section 2. Qualifications. to read:

"To be eligible for the office of national director a person shall be an active member in good standing of an adult club for at least five (5) years and served at least one (1) term as a district governor, area zone governor, or national director.

To be eligible for an executive office (President, President-Elect, Secretary, or Treasurer) a person shall be an active member in good standing of an adult club for at least five (5) years and served at least one (1) term as a National Director.

No member of the Board of Directors who has completed a full term will be eligible for election to any National Office until a lapse of one (1) year."

<u>Previously this article stated:</u> **Article V** – **Officers Section 2. Qualifications.** "To be eligible for an office in Ruritan National a person shall be an active member in good standing of an adult club for at least five (5) years and have served one (1) term as a member of a district cabinet or one (1) term as an area zone governor."

Rationale: To require additional qualifications of candidates running for the National Board in an attempt to attract better qualified candidates.

Bylaws Issue #2

Vote to change National Bylaws Article XI – Electronic Meetings to read:

The BOD, EXCOM, standing committees, and special committees are authorized to meet by telephone conference or through other electronic communications media so long **as a quorum is present and all members in attendance can** simultaneously participate (by whatever means) during the meeting. All other guidance from the bylaws and board policy applies to meetings of committees and board of directors.

<u>Previously this article stated:</u> <u>Article XI – Electronic Meetings</u>: The BOD, EXCOM, standing committees, and special committees are authorized to meet by telephone conference or through other electronic communications media so long as all the members may simultaneously hear each other and participate during the meeting.

Rationale: To allow an electronic meeting to take place with a quorum present.

Note that delegate certification closes at 9 a.m. Saturday, January 17, 2015 in Greensboro with voting to take place from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday.


