Mission Statement

“The Ruritan National Foundation provides financial assistance to qualified individuals or groups for educational, charitable, and benevolent activities.”

Purpose

The purpose of the Ruritan National Foundation is to manage and maintain a trust for the encouragement, promotion and financing of the charitable, educational and benevolent principles and activities of Ruritan clubs and of Ruritan National. Significant elements of the Ruritan National Foundation are its educational scholarship programs. These programs assist students in furthering their formal education past high school.

Foundation Bylaws state: *“The Foundation gives grants to individuals for post-secondary education.... Income from growth in investments, interest and dividends will be used to fund the educational programs of the Foundation.”*

Thus, the RNFI Board of Trustees assumes a fiduciary responsibility to manage gifts for educational programs in trust, with the intent to maintain the corpus or principal and to produce income in perpetuity. Ruritan has encouraged donations to named “permanent funds” to build principle that will earn income to fund educational programs.

Earned income from Foundation principle is derived from dividends, interest, and growth of principal. Endowments are either unrestricted or restricted. The type of endowment determines source and purposed use of earnings.

Governance

Ruritan National Foundation, Inc., incorporated in 2008, is a 501(c)3 Not for Profit Association that is administered by five National Trustees who are Ruritan members.

Delegates at the 1968 Ruritan National Convention in Virginia Beach, VA, amended the Ruritan National Constitution to establish the Ruritan National Foundation and provide for the election of its five trustees. Trustees are elected at National Conventions and serve a five-year term. These Trustees meet at least twice a year to conduct the business of the National Foundation.

History of Ruritan National Foundation

(Reprint from *Ruritan Saga Book*)

At a meeting of the Executive Committee of Ruritan National on December 28, 1949, attended by National President Garland Gray, Executive Secretary Marvin Gray, Past National Presidents L. T. Hall and Charlie E. Myers (National Secretary Tom Downing was absent), a check for \$1,000.00 was presented to Executive Secretary Marvin Gray by President Garland Gray for deposit to the Ruritan National account in a Special Education Fund. This contribution by President Garland equaled the amount of reimbursement he had received from Ruritan National for his expenses during the year as president.

The purpose of this special fund was to provide financial assistance through scholarship loans to deserving young people who planned to continue their formal education after graduation from high school.

The following year Ruritan National President Curtis Old, at a meeting of the Board of Directors in May, appointed three members to make recommendations regarding use of the educational fund. Members of this Committee were: Garland Gray, L. T. Hall, and C. E. Myers.

The fund remained dormant, retaining its \$1,000.00 balance, plus accrued interest, until the year 1957. At that time one student, name unknown, was loaned \$250.00 for educational use.

The next year, a second loan in the amount of \$500.00 was made to Charlotte Sims.

By the end of 1960, both loans had been repaid. The fund balance at that time, including principal and interest, amounted to \$1,164.00

In September, 1964, Marvin L. Gray, Ruritan National Executive Secretary, died. It was requested by his family that flowers be omitted and instead that contributions be made to the Educational Fund. A total of \$755.00 was contributed.

On August 30, 1965, H. I. Davis, a member of the National Board of Directors, also died. A gift of \$3,000.00 was received by Ruritan National from his brothers and sister to provide a recognition program in his memory. Acceptance of the gift by the Board was subject to mutual agreement concerning the kind of recognition to be made.

The family initially proposed a loving cup to be awarded to the district with the highest percent attendance at the national convention.

When advised of the problems involved in administering such a program, the family suggested an annual award to be given to "The Outstanding Ruritan of the Year". The Board felt that this program would also be difficult to administer.

The Board suggested to the family that a permanent fund be established in a foundation. Any gifts to such a fund would be tax deductible to the donor. The family agreed to put this money in escrow pending acceptance of its use.

Because of continued delays in establishing a tax exempt foundation, the family requested the funds be returned. This request was complied with by the Ruritan National Board, with regrets expressed to the family.

During this time, the Board's attention was called to the problems related to gifts that were subject to restriction imposed by the donor. As a result, a policy was later formulated and approved.

In December 1968, Ruritan National Vice President Wendell Simmons died. The affection and esteem of his fellow Ruritans was expressed through the establishment of the Wendell Simmons Memorial Fund. At the end of one year from the time the first contribution was received, more than \$3,000.00 had been added to the fund.

A third fund was established prior to 1970 by W. S. Jansen, a Ruritan member from Ohio, who contributed \$1,000.00 in memory of his wife. This fund was named the Mary E. Jansen Memorial Fund.

The net worth of these three special funds at the end of the sixties, including the amount of loans made to students, amounted to more than \$5,000.00.

The responsibility for administering these funds was assigned to the Ruritan National Education Committee from 1964 to 1970. Past National President Garland Gray was appointed in 1964 to serve as the first Chairman of this Committee by National President Russell Burgess. He continued to serve as a member of the Committee until 1969. R. E. Thompson, Ruritan National Treasurer, served as Chairman of the Committee from 1966 to 1970.

By action of the National Board of Directors in August, 1965, the name of the Educational Fund was changed to "The Garland Gray and Marvin Gray Educational Loan Fund".

It was at this meeting that 1963 Ruritan National President Harold Singleton recommended that the Planning and Survey Committee be instructed to investigate the possibility of establishing a Ruritan National Foundation that would be eligible to receive gifts that could be counted as a tax deduction by donors. It was Harold's feeling at this time that funds from such a Foundation could also be used to help fellow Ruritans in need as a result of a catastrophe.

Policy for administering the Education Loan Fund was approved by the Board at the January, 1966 meeting to wit:

Any qualified high school graduate who had need of financial assistance to continue his or her formal education would be eligible to make application for a loan not to exceed \$500.00. All loans to be interest free until one year after graduation or withdrawal from school. At this time, a charge of four percent interest would be due on any unpaid principal amount. Each application would have to be submitted with letters of reference from two Ruritan members.

At this meeting of the Board, Executive Secretary Russell Burgess was appointed to serve as Ex Officio member of the Education Committee.

At a meeting in March, 1967, the Board, upon recommendation of Past National President Edwin H. Ragsdale, who was serving as the Chairman of the Planning and Survey Committee, approved the establishment of a Ruritan National Foundation.

The Board, at its August 1967 meeting, approved an amendment to the Ruritan National Constitution, which was to be voted on by the delegates attending the 40th Annual Convention held at Virginia Beach, in January, 1968.

The amendment, as approved, provided for the establishment of a Foundation to manage and maintain a Trust for the encouragement, promotion, and financing of the charitable, educational, and benevolent principles and activities of Ruritan clubs and Ruritan National.

Further, the approval provided that an agreement be entered into between Ruritan National and the Ruritan National Foundation for the proper administration of the Foundation by a five-member Board of Trustees to be initially appointed by the National President. Thereafter, Trustees were to be elected at the national convention for five year terms. This agreement also provided that the Ruritan National Foundation, both to its purpose and its operation, meet all the requirements necessary for a tax exempt Foundation under the Internal Revenue Code of the United States.

At the end of the 1968 National Convention, the first Trustees of the Foundation were appointed by National President Charles Allen, immediately after the 1968 National Convention. They were: Robert F. Smith, Past National President, Chairman; Harold B. Singleton, Past National President; Frank Kellam, Past National President; Charles Barrett and Keith Snyder, both Past National Directors.

General policy regarding the successful establishment and administration of the Foundation was approved by these men and those who were elected to succeed them in office until present time.

Policy approved that:

The Foundation Funds were to be used only for educational purposes.

A permanent fund, to be identified by name must equal or exceed \$1,000.00.

A Ruritan National Foundation emblem was adopted.

No more than one half of principal funds could be used for loans at any one time.

Interest received would be used for awarding of grants.

A Foundation brochure be printed.

A donor may be allowed to make certain stipulations regarding a gift, provided the total amount is not less than \$10,000.00 and so long as the stipulations are not in conflict with the purposes of the Foundation.

The Trustees continued to publicize and promote the Foundation program through distribution of the brochure sent to all clubs, by monthly reports in the Ruritan magazine, personal contact, and correspondence.

As a result of all these efforts, the Foundation grew from a total of \$7,400.00 (the amount received from the Education Committee in 1970, including notes receivable from students) to a total of \$72,000.00 in 1978.

Because of his personal interest in the Foundation program, Ruritan National President Robert Wrenn proposed, at the beginning of the 50th Anniversary Year, that each Ruritan member contribute \$1 to the Foundation in commemoration of the anniversary.

Twenty-nine permanent funds were established during this period since the first fund in 1949 and approximately 20 additional funds have been started in the same time, through 1978.

The continued support of Ruritan members and clubs has made it possible for more deserving young people to receive financial assistance to continue their formal education. There is no way to measure the value of a grant until someone devises a way to measure the values of a life itself and how life's values are enhanced by a broader educational experience. However, ask any one of the

deserving students who have been helped through this program and you can be assured of a thankful response.

Such is the Ruritan principle continuing to minister to the needs of deserving people.

Source of Funds

Primary funding for the Ruritan National Foundation is identified in the Bylaws: "Income from growth in investments, interest and dividends will be used to fund the educational programs of the Foundation." Foundation donations are applied to any fund or funds designated by the donor, but only the donor is credited for the donation. In other words, a check from a club or district may not be counted as a donation from an individual nor can a check from an individual be counted as a donation from a club or district.

All donations to Ruritan National Foundation are potentially tax deductible. Donations to the National Foundation in honor or memory of an individual are welcome. Donations of any size are gratefully received. Donations may be given to the National Foundation in memory of a deceased individual, in lieu of flowers and the family of the deceased will be notified of the gift. Appropriate donations may include cash or appreciated property such as stocks or bonds. Land or buildings may be donated if environmentally acceptable and approved by the Foundation Board. The Foundation may also be listed as the beneficiary of an insurance policy. Ruritan and friends are encouraged to remember the Foundation in their wills and trusts.

Unrestricted or General Funds

Unrestricted or General funds have no donor restrictions. Earnings are used for Foundation purposes like Build Your Dollar (BY\$) scholarships, staff support, travel expenses, audit and management expenses, or where most needed. Sources of income for BY\$ and other expenses include the Tom Downing Fellowship, District Educational funds, all permanent funds with a balance below \$10,000, or funds above \$10,000 without stipulated restricted designated guidelines.

Restricted Contract Funds

Restricted Contract Funds have donor stipulated purposes that are allowed if funds have a minimum principle balance of \$10,000 or greater. Donors specify restrictions regarding the purpose or use of earnings in a Contract Fund agreement.

Use of Funds

The financial assets of the Ruritan National Foundation are invested by the National Trustees. Earned income from these investments are given as scholarships to further students' education or training beyond high school.

Build Your Dollars Scholarship Program

Foundation Build Your Dollars (BY\$) Scholarships are a great way to increase your club's support of higher education. BY\$ scholarships were started by the Foundation as a partnership with local clubs to encourage every club to consider providing scholarships as a community service, to help more local students continue their education, and to generate publicity and goodwill for RN and local clubs.

In addition to BY\$ scholarships, many clubs are choosing to provide locally controlled scholarship funds. Clubs are encouraged to create endowed scholarships with the RN Foundation and to make scholarships available in perpetuity.

Reserve a BY\$ scholarship for your Club and provide a larger scholarship check for a local student.

All club checks may be submitted from beginning of the year until ending date of October 1 (postmarked on or before).

Build Your Dollar Deposit and Claim forms are available online at <http://ruritan.org>

1. Participating clubs must send a club check for \$300 as a deposit, not a donation, to reserve a RNF BY\$ award for a local student. The Club check along with the Foundation *BY\$ Program Deposit Form* must be postmarked on or before October 1 for the club to be eligible. RNF will notify the participating clubs after receiving the club check confirming the club is in the program. Please provide a name and mailing address of the preferred club officer to receive the Build Your Dollar confirmation.
2. The Club will complete the one page *Build Your Dollar Claim Form* and submit to the Foundation by June 30, 2018. The club will be given options for the \$300 contribution if application is not received completed by June 30. If not approved for a grant, options are (1) request \$300 refund returned to club (2) carry-over into the next years' Build Your Dollar program (3) leave as a donation to RNF. The club must return the claim form by June 30th.

There is one application maximum and one scholarship maximum per club. The club selects the recipient. In selecting applicants, clubs should consider financial need, character, scholarship, academic promise, and desire.

The \$300 from the club will be increased with a scholarship from the Foundation based on interest and dividend income, plus realized capital gains, less expenses of the Foundation as well as all qualified roll over scholarships from the past years program.

Responsibilities

National Trustees

- Manage and maintain a trust for the encouragement, promotion and financing of the charitable, educational and benevolent principles and activities of Ruritan clubs and of Ruritan National.
- Develop financial investment and administrative policy for the Ruritan National Foundation.
- Promote long-range strategic and financial planning.
- Promote and encourage participation in National Foundation projects and campaigns.
- Work to secure corporate donations and sponsorships.
- Promote and support annual giving by clubs, districts and individuals.

District Promotion Chairperson

- Approved by the Ruritan National Trustees in 1981 for appointment by each district. Their responsibilities are to promote the National Foundation's purpose, encourage financial support and educate the clubs on what is available from the Foundation. District Promotion Chairperson should attend club meetings and is an active, voting member of the district cabinet. This individual is one who will be concerned with the advancement of the Ruritan National Foundation.

Club Foundation Promotion Chairperson

- Recommend each club appoint an individual as Club Promotion Chairperson.
- Suggest that one meeting during the year be related to the Ruritan National Foundation.

Fund Raising Programs

Provide scholarships to deserving students, change lives, and impact communities.

A Strong Ruritan Foundation.....supports education benefits for deserving youth!

General Gifts, Permanent Fund Gifts and Contract Fund Gifts: Every donation to the Foundation is welcome and is used wisely. Donations, as well as audit information, are recognized in the Ruritan National portion of the Annual Report distributed at the National Convention.

All donations to Ruritan National Foundation are potentially tax deductible.

Acknowledgements are mailed for all donations.

General fund donations are made to increase individual, Club, Zone, or District named permanent funds that generate unrestricted income. Earned income from the permanent funds below the \$10,000 endowed level are unrestricted and is used to provide Build Your Dollar scholarships, pay necessary expenses and fees, and “where most needed.” Motivations for general fund gifts include honoring Tom Downing Fellows, memorials for individuals, or additions to a permanent fund.

Encourage donations in honor of a family member or friend or for special service. Encourage donations in lieu of flowers as a memorial during a time of grieving and as an annual remembrance of deceased members. The family of a deceased or honored person will be notified of the gift(s) to Ruritan National Foundation (an address for the family must be provided.)

Annual/fiscal year donations are important to support the Foundation unrestricted needs. They are recognized by level and donor name in the combined Ruritan National and Ruritan National Foundation Annual Report.

Donation Levels:

Gold: \$1,000 and up

Silver: \$500-\$999

Bronze: \$100-\$499

Birthday Funds

Birthday Fund donations celebrate the birthdays of members, the anniversary of the local club, and the birth of Ruritan in Holland, VA in 1928.

For Club Donations: Two (2) dollars per member qualifies Club for a certificate from Ruritan National Foundation. Ten (10) dollars per member qualifies a Club for a plaque from Ruritan National Foundation. Recognition of donations received in Ruritan National Office based on fiscal year from October 1 to September 30. After September 30, donations received are applied to the next fiscal year.

Encourage support of the Ruritan National Foundation through the Birthday Fund.

Tom Downing Fund

The largest permanent fund honors Tom Downing - and over 1,800 outstanding leaders - who have been named **Tom Downing Fellows**. Over \$1,000,000 is in the fund and it has a huge impact on Foundation scholarship awards. For example, if average net earnings were 4.0% per year, the Tom Downing fund generates over \$40,000 per year for BY\$ scholarship awards.

Tom Downing was an exemplary Ruritan leader. He, along with J.J. Gwaltney, developed the idea of a service organization called Ruritan. Tom was elected National Director in 1930, Second Vice President in 1933, followed by First Vice President in 1934 and National President in 1935. He also served as National Secretary in 1945 and served continuously until he retired in 1973.

Each Tom Downing Fellow award requires a \$500 donation. The donor must state when the contribution is made that it is for participation in the Tom Downing Fellow Program. A plaque and a lapel pin, designed in the likeness of Tom Downing, will be presented to the recipient. Once presented, the designation as a Tom Downing Fellow is non-transferable and will be a lasting honor to this individual. A Tom Downing Fellow does not have to be a Ruritan member.

A number of current Ruritans are working hard to recognize more Tom Downing Fellows. Foundation leaders are raising money in District golf tournaments, and other events, and offering to match half of a Tom Downing award that a Club wants to make. First come – first awarded. All gifts to recognize Tom Downing Fellows are credited to the Tom Downing Fund and earnings are used to fund Build Your Dollar scholarships. It is truly a win/win/win proposition.

Permanent Funds

Permanent Funds enable Ruritan National Foundation to build a larger endowment with earnings being used for Board-approved Build Your Dollar scholarships, unrestricted needs, or other designated purposes. Permanent funds are recognized by Ruritan National Foundation as a way to involve Districts, clubs and individuals in building a larger pooled endowment and to generate more earnings for increased Build Your Dollar Scholarships. Funds become permanent with a \$1,000 gift. Permanent funds carry the names of the individual, District, Club, or individual who provided sufficient contributions to initiate the fund.

Permanent Fund Memorials and Recognition

Ruritan districts, clubs, individual members and families are encouraged to establish a specific permanent names fund as a memorial for loved ones. A \$1,000 minimum is needed to establish a permanent fund and can be obtained through one lump sum or through multiple gifts.

Names are published in the Ruritan National and Foundation Annual Report in the year in which the \$1,000 requirement is reached. The fund names are also listed on the Foundation website once the fund reaches the \$1000 minimum. Each Permanent Fund will always retain its identity and perpetuate the name of the individual, Club, or District.

Permanent fund donors with a commitment to create an endowed fund can follow “steps” to reach endowed levels of \$10,000 or higher.

Permanent Fund Levels

- \$1,000: **Permanent Fund**
- \$2,100: **21st Century Fund (RNF adds last \$100)**
- \$5,000: **Cornerstone Fund (RNF adds last \$500)**
- \$10,000: **Friends Fund**
- \$20,000: **Special Fund**
- \$50,000: **Golden 68 (recognizing \$50,000 and 50 years since 1968)**

Note: Larger endowed fund levels may be identified.

21st Century Legacy Fund

An amount of \$2100 is required to start a *21st Century Fund*. \$100 from the National Foundation miscellaneous fund will be automatically added to the fund once it reaches or exceeds \$2000 as long as funds are available. *21st Century Fund* Level Clubs, individuals, businesses and districts will be recognized at Foundation Fellowship Celebrations and in the Foundation Annual Report.

Cornerstone Funds

Once a fund is established and reaches \$4500, \$500 from the National Foundation General fund will automatically be added to bring the total to \$5000 as long as funds are available. This fund will be permanent with the completion of \$5,000 in donations.

This fund can be obtained through one lump sum or through individual donations until \$5,000 is reached. Funds from the \$1,000 permanent fund and 21st Century Fund may be the basis for building a Cornerstone Fund.

As a permanent fund, money donated to the Cornerstone Fund may be for the purpose of honoring someone or memorializing someone. Money may be donated by an individual, a club, any other Ruritan entity, business, foundation, wills, stocks, bonds, or by other means. Cornerstone Fund level Clubs, individuals, businesses and districts will be recognized at Foundation Fellowship Celebrations, at appropriate functions, and in the Foundation Annual Report.

Friends Endowed Fund (Contract Funds)

A *Friends of Ruritan National Foundation Fund* is established by an individual, club, or district donation of a minimum of \$10,000 to the National Foundation. Since \$10,000 is also the minimum required for an endowment, a Friends Fund is an endowed fund and earned income may be designated for a local scholarship.

A *Friends of Ruritan National Foundation Fund* can be a one-time donation of \$10,000 or accumulate over a period of time to become a Friends Fund. The donations do not have to be from a Ruritan member. Once a fund reaches the Friends level the owner(s) of the fund can sign an agreement (contract) with the Foundation Trustees and then solicit applications for a separate scholarship. An agreement will be established between the donor and the Ruritan National Foundation stating the terms of the Friends account.

The **Contract Fund Scholarship claim form** can be found on the Ruritan National Foundation website.

Note: Existing Permanent Funds for deceased members may not be combined with other funds.

Special Endowed Funds (Contract Funds)

Special Permanent Endowed Funds are established with donations totaling \$20,000 or more. Grants made from Special Funds may include reasonable donor restrictions identified in an executed Agreement. Restrictions can be placed such as how funds are disbursed, field of studies recipients are entering, etc. For example, if requested by the donor, funds may be disbursed in a certain geographic area or limited to certain fields of study. These educational grants are made from the earnings generated by these Special Funds.

Other Gifts

Cash, stocks, bonds, or the National Foundation may be listed as the beneficiary in an insurance policy. All gifts are potentially tax deductible to the donor.

Auction items for Ruritan National Foundation auctions: The National Foundation is not responsible for determining value of donated items for National Foundation auctions. No such receipts will be given.

Garland Gray Awards (based on fiscal year)

A plaque will be presented at National Convention for first place winners and a certificate for the second and third place winners for the following:

Operation We Care

Operation We Care, a joint effort between Ruritan National and the Ruritan National Foundation, provides assistance to victims of situations officially declared disasters by the state and federal governments. Operation We Care (OWC) disaster relief fills in the gaps of assistance when other relief agencies have completed their work. When a disaster strikes a Ruritan district, the Ruritan district governor is responsible for surveying the damage and determining if OWC assistance is needed. The District Officers' Handbook lists the procedures all district governors must follow to request OWC disaster relief. Ruritan clubs and individuals are encouraged to make donations to Operation We Care. All donations are potentially tax deductible and will remain in a special Ruritan National Foundation fund until disaster relief is requested. The *Operation We Care Situation Report* used by the District Governors to request OWC funds is found on the Ruritan National Foundation website.

Operation We Care recognition

A recognition program has been established for donations to the OWC program. A donation to Operation We Care of two (2) dollars per member will qualify a club for a certificate or ten (10) dollars per member will qualify for a plaque. The awards are presented at the district conventions.

Clubs that give a donation of two (2) dollars per member or ten (10) per member to the Operation We Care Program will also have their names listed in the Annual Report presented at the National Convention.
